What Is CIMS?

- A workflow and reporting system
- A secure data transfer system
- An outbound communication system
- A data collection system

CIMS *Workbooks*

Data are issued to locals via “*Workbooks.*”
Four *Workbooks* are issued annually:

- August 15 (Part B)
- September 15 (Part C)
- December 15 (Part B and C)
- April 15 (Part B and C)

We've Come a Long Way!

- 35 Workbooks and Modules launched
- Over 2,000 total on-the-ground users
- Process improvements
 - New workflow and forms for SLCAP process
 - Way to report and label findings differently
 - New workflow and form set for discipline toolkit
- Data access improvements
 - Determinations distributed in CIMS
 - More student-level data on the Strand Report

CIMS vs. New System

CIMS is like a printing press or front loader:
Very good at doing what it was built for



CIMS vs. New System

New system needs to be more like a train:

- An engine can pull any number of cars along a track
- Cars can be exchanged between trains



Thinking About the New System

- Rollout of the new system will be spread out over the entire 2015–2016 academic year
- The new system will be more than just monitoring
- The frequency and timing of the work in the new system will be different than CIMS

Thinking About the New System

- Auto-save and spell check
- Robust IT (tablet-friendly)
- Different design approach than CIMS 2.0 (design input throughout)

- **Curated** trend and snapshot data visualization

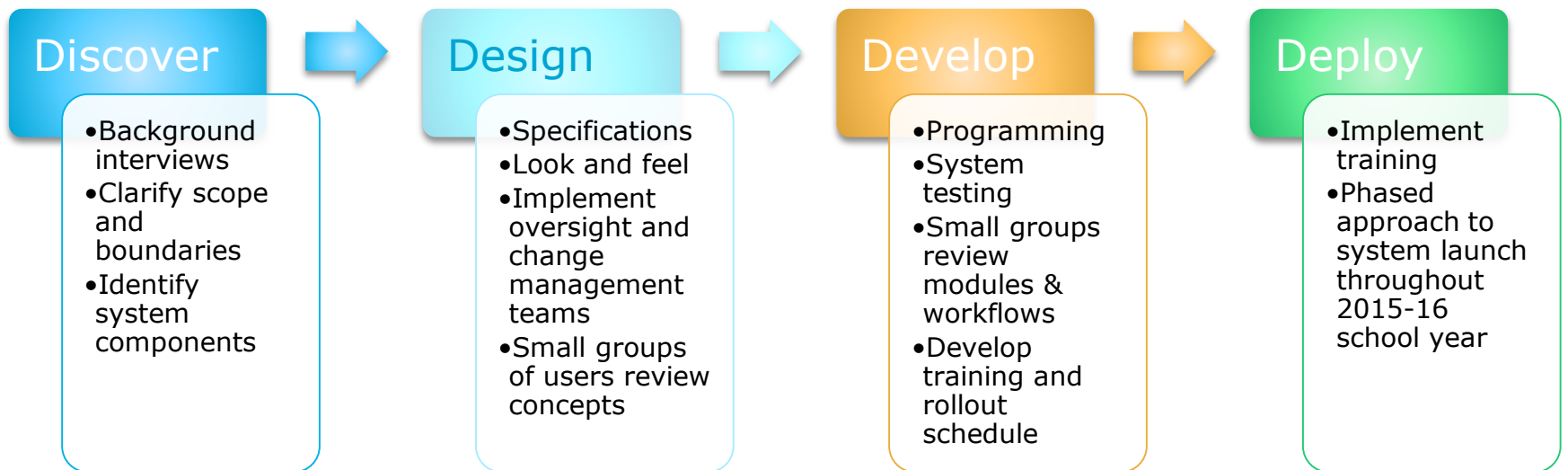


Outcomes Focused

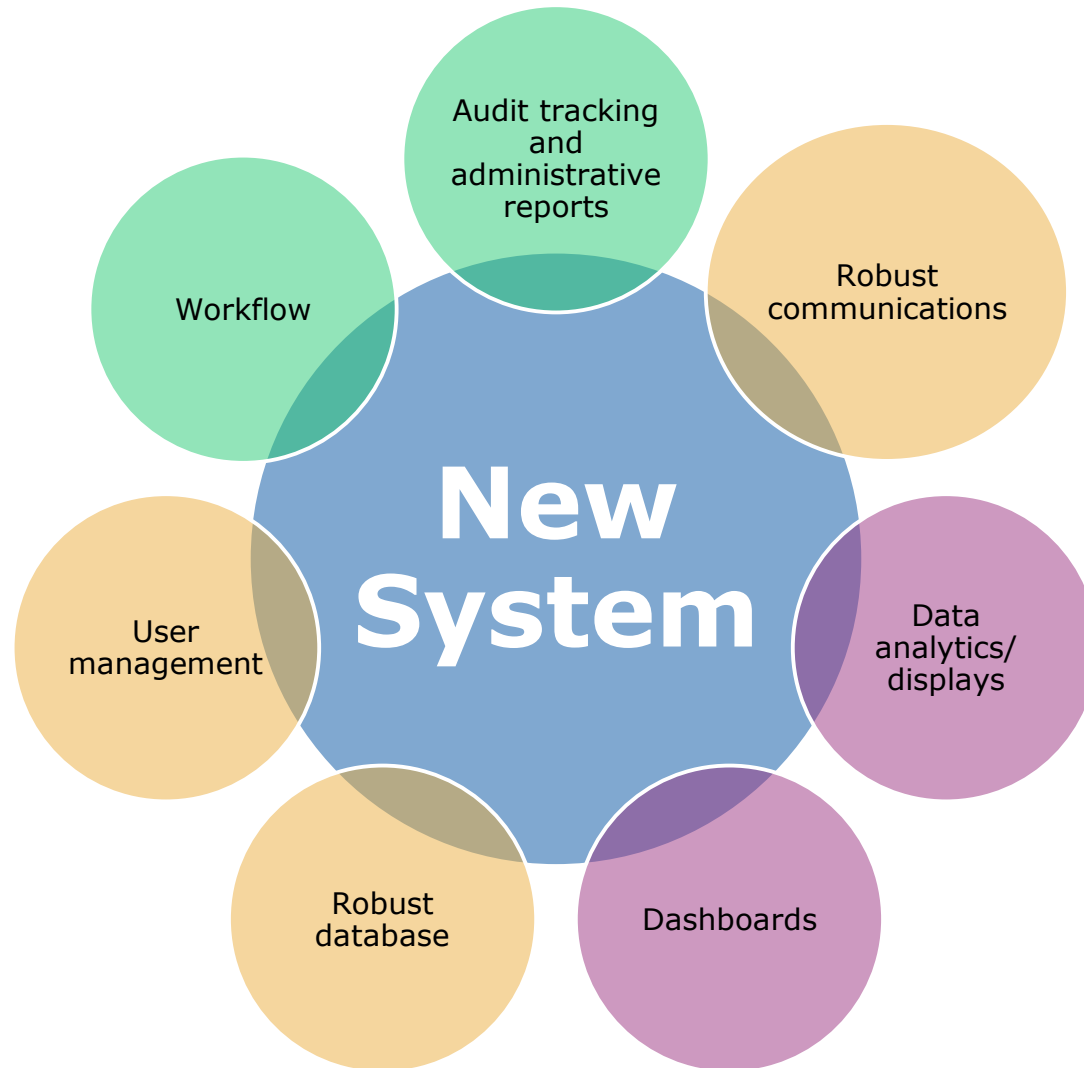

Rollout Timing

- August:
 - B-5 (Educational Environments)
 - B-13 (Secondary Transition)
 - General Supervision Monitoring
 - Discipline Toolkit
 - Significant Disproportionality: Educational Environments
 - Significant Disproportionality: Discipline
 - Determinations

(Part C does not begin until October)

Rollout Timing

- October (forecast):
 - B-9 and B-10 (Disproportionate Representation in Special Education)
 - Significant Disproportionality Identification
 - Significant Disproportionality: Identification and Indicator B-9
 - Significant Disproportionality: Identification and Indicator B-10
 - ISD Plans
 - Part C General Supervision Monitoring
 - Part C Focused Monitoring
